Consent

Magnetic Resonance Imaging uses a very strong magnet and radio waves to produce images based on the varying hydrogen content in the tissues of the body. The hydrogen molecules release energy imparted to them by the MRI system that is later translated into a group of pictures. This imaging method is the best way to see within bones, tendons, ligaments, and soft tissues. When appropriate, we inject a contrast material containing gadolinium to add valuable information to your exam.

Magnetic Resonance Angiography Venography uses principles similar to MRI, MRA an MRV is used specifically to image arteries or veins. When appropriate, we inject a contrast material containing gadolinium to add valuable Information to your exam.

Magnetic Resonance Arthrography An arthrogram is a picture of a joint-most often a shoulder, knee, elbow, wrist, or hip. In these cases, we use diluted contrast material containing gadolinium injected into a vein in the arm or injected directly into the joint. This contrast material makes the parts of the joint and more notable cartilage tears, more evident. This procedure is usually reserved for complicated post-operative or sports injury cases.

X- Is MR safe? For nearly everyone, the answer is YES! However, some surgically implanted metals or mechanical devices are not compatible with MR scanning and can pose a threat to your safety.
